
ORDER


These matters came on for consideration on the Report and Recommendation of the Administrative Law Judge in the above-captioned appeals.

REPORT AND RECOMMENDATION

To the Honorable State Personnel Board of Review:

This matter came on for consideration upon Appellant's filing of an appeal with this Board. On January 21, 2015, Appellant filed a letter with this Board dated April 29, 2014. In that letter, Appellant requested that the Board review Appellee's job audit decision regarding the job classification and pay level assigned to his position. The matters requested for review were designated as the above-referenced appeals.

By questionnaire dated February 11, 2015, Appellee was asked to supplement the record with information regarding Appellant's classification title and number both before and after the job audit, as well as the date Appellant received notification of the results of his audit. In its February 26, 2015, response, Appellee indicated that the audit resulted in no change to the classification title or number of Appellant's position, Water and Wastewater Maintenance Services Supervisor, class number 54350. Appellee further indicated that Appellant was notified of the results of the audit on April 10, 2014. Appellant filed no memorandum *contra* or otherwise disputed the information provided by Appellee.

Ohio Administrative Code Section 124-1-03(C) provides that appeals of reclassifications must be filed within thirty calendar days after receiving notice of the results of a position audit. Appellant's appeal was filed with this Board more than eight months after receiving notice of the results of the position audit. Accordingly, I find that the State Personnel Board of Review is without jurisdiction to hear the

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appeal because it was not filed within thirty calendar days after receiving notice of the position audit results.

I further find that this Board has no jurisdiction to review the pay level assigned to Appellant's position. Pursuant to R.C. 305.17, the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners is the body empowered to assign the compensation for Appellant's position, and this Board possesses no statutory authority to modify their determination.

Therefore, I respectfully **RECOMMEND** that the instant appeals be **DISMISSED** for untimely filing, and for lack of jurisdiction over the subject matter of the appeal.
